While listening to an assortment of elegiac selection of Tchaikovsky and Beethoven, he watches the lost beauty of his vanished world on the 1973 version of an IMAX screen. In Logan's Run², the population and the consumption of resources of a computer-run world are maintained in equilibrium by killing everyone who reaches the age of thirty. People happily and eagerly either die or watch. In Cloud Atlas³, slave labour clones are recycled into food for other clones in a factory-boat travelling from city to city.

By enforcing an overly technical/architectural vocabulary to represent these places where death actually happens. It is anyway interesting to note that the bodies (at least in the so-far selected case studies) disappear. They are not a burden anymore; the world is left clean and unmodified, allowing us (the living) to focus on what really matters (a paradoxical, neverending, unquestioned everyday). The experience of death has escaped the accidental realm (even if it obviously still happens) to become a fearless and fully accepted climax in our life.



07. & 08. Pasement / Redies transported and leaded enterwards dispectal trucks for further processing.


07 & 08. Basement / Bodies transported and loaded onto waste disposal trucks for further processing.

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

03. Transit corridor to Carousel.


04. Audience terrace / Crowd taking place for the ceremony.

07. Renewal stage (upper area) / Participants renewed. 08. Audience terrace / Crowd celebrating.

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
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








- 01. External view of the GEO-R93, "Exultation" ceremony boat / Fabricants boarding.

 08. Refrigerating unit (storage) / Bodies stored before further processing.











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
